Appendix A: A Monument Designer's Checklist

Preliminary

- 1. Get a copy of the bylaws of the cemetery in which you are considering obtaining plots.
- 2. Look around the cemetery at the monuments from the last 20-years. Many cemeteries have made rule changes in most cases due to maintenance related issues, so if there is a monument style or size that existed 50 or 100-years ago, it may no longer be allowed.
- 3. There are things that people want to include that might be considered an "insider joke." If it is something that could be misunderstood by a passerby, you might consider using it in the context of Section 1, Chapter 9. titled, "Pebbles, Pebbles and More Pebbles."
